Miscellaneous Materials Written or Collected by the Revd Canon Edwin Kingston (1902-1961)

1932-1961

Edwin Kingston was born in Co Cork on 2 September 1902. He was educated at Trinity College Dublin where he received a BA in 1931. He continued his education in TCD with his Divinity Test in 1932 and an MA in 1934.

He was ordained for the diocese of Connor in 1932 as curate of Ballymeena, 1932-1935. He then served as curate at St Michael's, Belfast (Connor), 1935-1938. In 1938, Kingston transferred to the diocese of Clogher where he served until his death in 1961. He served firstly as curate-in-charge of Cleenish, 1938-1944 and then rector of Cleenish, 1944-1951. In 1951, he became curate-in charge of Magheracross, 1951-1957 and then rector of Magheracross, 1957-1961.

In addition to his parochial duties, Kingston served as rural dean of Kilskeery, 1959-1961 and prebendary of Donacavey, 1959-1961.

Kingston's clerical education and work are reflected in this collection. Material includes his various licences and appointments while his clerical education is reflected by material such as his New Testament ordination Bible.

Kingstone died 1 January 1961 and was buried in Craghan Cemetery, Ballinamallard.
