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The strategy of the RB Executive Committee includes the need to consider committee

succession planning.

As you will appreciate the members of the Representative Body of the Church of Ireland

comprise the archbishops and bishops of the Church of Ireland as ex-officio members, and one

clerical and two lay representatives from each diocese or united dioceses, plus co-opted

members equal in number to the number of dioceses or united dioceses.

Therefore, since the formation of the amalgamated Dioceses of Tuam, Limerick and Killaloe,

the number of members of the Representative Body has fallen from 60 to 55. It is from this

membership that the members are nominated to the committees of the RB, including the

Executive Committee and its sub-committees.

At the same time there has also been an increase in the demand from regulators in terms of

governance, compliance and reporting, requiring specific skills which are highlighted in this

bill. The skills identified, being expertise in the areas of finance, pensions, investment

management, accountancy, human resources and law should not be seen as exhaustive but more

indicative of the general skills required to adequately govern a complex charity like the

Representative Church Body. We could have expanded this list to include property

development or information technology, but the more important point is that the committees of

the Representative Body require members with technical skills, and the needs of each

committee will be unique.

The next point I would like to make is that this bill highlights the need to consider diversity of

age, gender and ethnic representation, as well as ensuring that representation comes from

throughout the island of Ireland. It is hoped that the introduction of this bill will allow the

Representative Body to appoint co-opted members to increase the participation of younger

members, improving gender diversity and improving ethnic representation.

Bill No.7 recognizes the skills and experience required to serve on the sub-committees of the

Representative Body of the Church of Ireland, while providing a mechanism by which the

Representative Body can appoint up to 18 co-opted members, previously 11.

I propose this bill.
